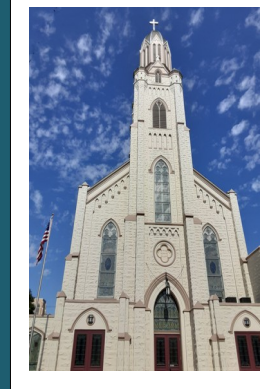

## A message from Pastor Keith

I officiate a lot of funerals. To be more precise, I average two funerals a week, a rate that I have maintained at least for the last two decades of ministry. And in these funerals, I officiate, it can be said that there are two primarily different agendas I have depending on whether the deceased knew Jesus as their Lord or not. I either preach the Gospel of Jesus to the family and friends of a nonprofessing individual or I preach the Gospel of Jesus to family and friends of a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ. Same message, just different approaches. And I always I pray I have been some comfort and enlightenment to both audiences.

But I can never hold a candle to Jesus' officiating at a funeral. In Luke 7:11-17, Jesus was visiting a city called Nain when all traffic stopped for a funeral procession. A widow was weeping as her only son had died. Being a widow, she not only lost the comfort and love of her son, she also lost the only source of her future existence. A huge crowd was walking with her probably asking each other what is she to do now!

But then comes Jesus. Our text states that first Jesus saw the mom. It simply says in the text "...And when the Lord saw her...". I am reminded here that Jesus always sees us and our needs. Secondly, it states that "...Jesus felt compassion...". Jesus is always in touch with His heart with our circumstances and threats in life. Then thirdly, Jesus goes against all the written and unwritten rules of living and "touches the coffin" defiling Himself in Jewish law. Jesus stops the funeral dead in its tracks and transforms a dirge into a dance! He raises the widow's son from the dead!

In reality, Jesus still changes every believer's funeral today as He stops the dirge and leads us in dancing. The loved one is now more alive than ever before. As Jesus said, "Those who believes in Him shall never die"! Jesus is still in the business of changing every funeral for those who believe in Him as Lord and as their Savior. Will Jesus change your funeral? Have a great month!

The Touching Story Behind "It Is Well with My Soul" Lyrics by Horatio G. Spafford. It Is Well with My Soul - Spoken Word by Lloyd Newell Life can be so unpredictable - joys and sorrows, beautiful blessings and distressing difficulties can come unexpectedly. Our life's dreams and plans can change in an instant. We all know this to be true. So how can we find peace amid such turbulence? Horatio Spafford knew something about life's unexpected challenges. He was a successful attorney and real estate investor who lost a fortune in the great Chicago fire of 1871. Around the same time, his beloved four-year-old son died of scarlet fever. Thinking a vacation would do his family some good, he sent his wife and four daughters on a ship to England, planning to join them after he finished some pressing business at home. However, while crossing the Atlantic Ocean, the ship was involved in a terrible collision and sunk. More than 200 people lost their lives, including all four of Horatio Spafford's precious daughters. His wife, Anna, survived the tragedy. Upon arriving in England, she sent a telegram to her husband that began: "Saved alone. What shall I do?" Horatio immediately set sail for England. At one point during his voyage, the captain of the ship, aware of the tragedy that had struck the Spafford family, summoned Horatio to tell him that they were now passing over the spot where the shipwreck had occurred.<sup>1</sup> As Horatio thought about his daughters, words of comfort and hope filled his heart and mind. He wrote them down, and they have since become a well-beloved hymn: When peace like a river, attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll— Whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to know It is well, it is well with my soul. Perhaps we cannot always say that everything is well in all aspects of our lives. There will always be storms to face, and sometimes there will be tragedies. But with faith in a loving God and with trust in His divine help, we can confidently say, "It is well, it is well with my soul."

MAY: (1) Financial Info: Total General Fund Assets Apr. 30, 2021, \$63,094.21; Total Endowments \$774,487.93. (2) Learned that JaneAnn Vest is returning to her position as Organist. (3) Heard a report from Randi Pearson about the budget to be presented at the Annual Meeting in June. (4) Received invitation from Alan and Jen Miller for a bond fire party at their home June 5 at 6:30 to celebrate life after Covid19. The entire Church Congregation was invited. (5) Discussed St. Paul's Missions and how these funds can be increased. (6) Heard a report on the progress of the Child Care Committee. Next step is to apply to the State for a Certificate of Occupancy then hire a director. Randi reminded everyone that it is a slow process and patience will be needed. (7) Read a thank you note from Debbie Motter Oakes thanking us for the kindness and hospitality shown to their family with the Funeral Lunch.

**ANNUAL MEETING:** (1) Financial Info: Total General Fund Assets Dec. 31, 2020, \$60,939.08; Endowments \$748,402.74 (2) Received the Budget recommendation. 4. We believe that each local church is ultimately answerable only to Jesus Christ, and not to any association, conference, council, synod, or any other ecclesiastical body.
5. We believe that it is proper and beneficial for each local church to seek fellowship and counsel of other such local churches.
